Similarly, simulation labs offer valuable practice opportunities for central line insertion and venepuncture, allowing healthcare professionals to develop precise skills in safe, controlled settings. This training improves both technical competence and decision-making under pressure.

By integrating simulation-based education into clinical training, we ensure that healthcare workers achieve mastery in both basic and complex procedures, ultimately enhancing patient safety and care outcomes. These labs are essential for continuous professional development, helping trainees stay current with evolving techniques and technologies. Regular use of these facilities fosters on going
